The Bath Cotswold League Road Race

RACE DESCRIPTION

Riders will line up outside the Hall. The start of the race will be neutralised. The riders will proceed along the A368 towards Bath and turn right towards Stowey. The race will start once the riders reach the finish line for the first time. The neutralised zone will be approximately 3kms.

The race continues to the A37 where you turn left and pass through the village of Clutton. There is then a fast descent to a left turn on the Chelwood roundabout on to the A368. There is then an undulating 4kms until the left turn back on to Stowey hill. The complete lap is 10kms.

The race will then complete 8 laps of the course with the finish line being at the top of Stowey. The race distance is 80kms. <http://ridewithgps.com/routes/30629975>

IMPORTANT NOTES

There are double white lines on the A37 and there is a "3rd lane" with chevrons on the descent. Riders are not permitted to cross the double white lines at any time. The A37 is a fast road and the descent is fast.

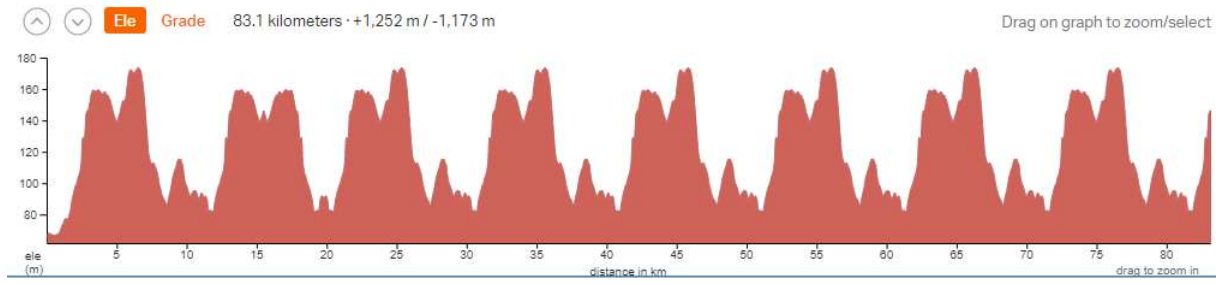
The section of the road from the top of Stowey to the A37 has been top dressed. The dressing has settled down but there are no white lines or cat's-eyes to mark the middle of the road. Please keep to your side of the road as this is a public road with oncoming traffic.

PARKING

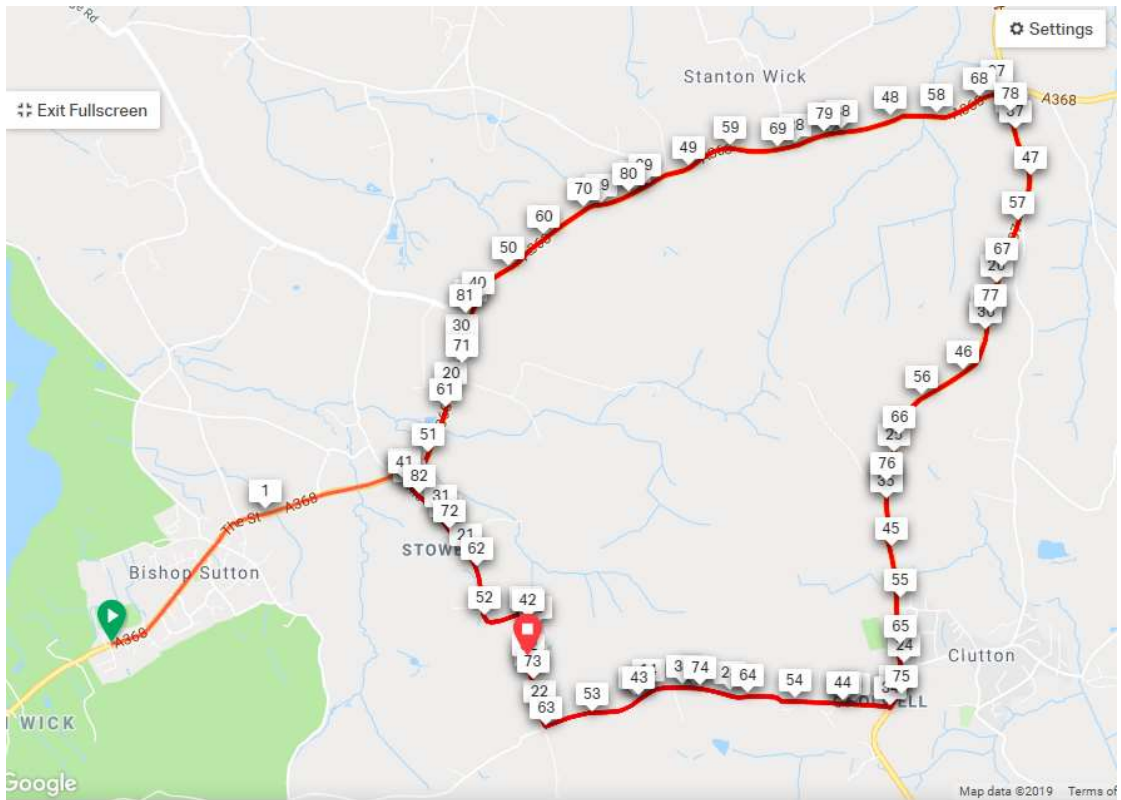
Please be considerate where you park.

- There is parking at the HQ. Please do not park in the residents only car park opposite the HQ
- There is limited Parking on the left hand side at the finish line. The farmer has kindly given us permission to use this area, but we must ensure that he has access at all times. The gates will be locked at 13:00.
- Ask your supporters to not park in front of Stowey Church or in the driveway for the A J Wyatt Animal Feed Supplies in Stowey
- If parking in the lane towards Hinton Blewitt. Please be considerate and do not park in any gateways or driveways

IMPORTANT NOTES TO RIDERS

HQ will open at 0845 and signing on will close at 09:30

Mandatory Riders Briefing will be held at the HQ at 09:50

Juniors to report to the licence steward for a gear check prior to signing on. Any Juniors in the top ten will be subject to a gear check at the finish line area, not at the HQ.

Riders more than 5 minutes behind the peloton will be withdrawn from the event to ensure rider safety

Please be considerate to the neighbours at the HQ we wish to use the HQ for future years.

Please use the changing facilities and toilets provided. Anyone caught urinating outside will be dis-qualified and fined.

All riders must race in the official BC registered design of their team.

Remember you are ambassadors for our sport, respect the rules of the road and obey the instructions of the Chief Commissaire. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

At the end of the race please continue on the road and turn right towards Hinton Blewitt. Continue on this road for 1km and turn right to Bishop Sutton. Do not retrace your route down Stowey Hill as there maybe other riders finishing the race.

Prize Presentation will be at 13:00 at the HQ. If you want your prize you must stay around.

Tea, Coffee, savoury rolls and cakes will be available at the HQ

Neutral Service Vehicle will be provided. Please bring clearly marked wheels to the HQ before the event

Rider safety guide

This race is run under British Cycling's technical regulations and under standard highway conditions therefore you MUST abide by the rules of the road.

Safety

- You are not on closed roads and you will face oncoming traffic

Marshals (static or moto)

- Direct riders around the course and warn other road users a race is taking place
- Marshals do not create road closures or make it safe to race on the right hand side of the road

Actions

- You are responsible for your own actions
- Race on the left hand side of the road – do not cross solid white lines and always avoid crossing broken white lines
- Persistent offenders will be penalised (eg disqualification or a fine)
- If necessary the race will be stopped

Responsibility

- Look after each other, behave responsibly and safely
- Do not take unnecessary risks - your actions could have serious consequences

Think

- About your position on the road
- Rider behaviour is critical to protecting the future of road racing
- We all have a part to play
